1. KSL: An Overview

Activities Reporting & Evidences

a) Introduction

For newly admitted First Year students, Research Department, Kathmandu School of Law organized a 10-day Onboarding Research. They were required to conduct research on theme of Opportunities and Challenges of Entrepreneurship. It was held from 22nd to 31st Bhadra, 2079. On 22nd Bhadra, students gathered in a conference hall of Kathmandu School of Law for orientation. They reassembled in same hall once more the next day to present their prospective questionnaires. They commenced their research on the 24th Bhadra. All of the students presented their findings to a jury and panels at Kathmandu School of Law on 30th and 31st of Bhadra, 2079.

b) Orientation

First-year BA.LLB students were given an orientation for the onboarding research on 22nd Bhadra, 2079. All 220, first-year students, were set to be sent on research. They were called to mark their presence that day so that they would be acquainted with the research and research methodology. There was set up seats for 75 students at a time. As a result, on Bhadra 22, the orientation was divided into three groups. There were roughly 75 students present for each group. From 10 AM onward, the first 75 students had orientation. After a 30-minute break, 75 more students were oriented for 1.5 hours. The final group with the same number of student was admitted once again at 2:30 PM, and orientation was conducted just as it had been earlier. Each group's orientation concluded with the students being divided into various sub-groups. They received two or three mentors who were supposed to assist them for the whole 10 days of their research.



The three orientation sessions were hosted by the duo of Suravi Rijal and Prakash B.K. They ran each session meticulously. Professor Hongkong Rana, Academic In-charge, was invited as the special guest; Professor Dr. Atindra Dahal had extended welcome and best wish note in the orientation. Assistant Professor Amrita Gautam, Teaching Assistants Sunila Deuja and Binda Kumari Thapa guided students about research. Professor Hongkong Rana discussed the advantages of conducting research and the reasons for doing so. Additionally, he discussed the academic

disciplines and criteria to evaluate students particularly about their disciplines. Following him, Professor Dr. Atindra Dahal spoke and gave his opinions on the same research project. He outlined numerous significances for research endeavors. He also covered Kathmandu School of Law's ethical values. Eventually, he sent his best wishes to all the students to finish their research projects successfully.



Teaching Assistant Binda Kumari Thapa and Assistant Professor Amrita Gautam together provided an explanation of what research is and how it is carried out. What are the different types of research one can conduct? What are the difficulties that one faces when conducting research? What should one concentrate on while conducting research? What significance do doctrinal and empirical researches hold? What should a researcher's overall objective be? Both mentioned lecturers went into great deal about these several topics. Sunila Deuja, a teaching assistant, eventually was on the podium to introduce students to a realistic scenario or, more precisely, how they would do research. What they had to do and had not to do. What specific region they had to focus on and what else. She explained all these details and after so the orientation session ended in a very decent tone. Before each subgroup was sent for workshop, respective assigned mentor was asked to pick up a lottery to confirm 1 among 15 predefined sectors for research on given theme.



c) Workshop

Following the orientation, each subgroup of tentatively 15 participants and 2/3 mentors were sent to a workshop. There was a total of 15 subgroups. They created and framed a questionnaire in a three-hour workshop. Members of the technical team thoroughly monitored and evaluated their discussion sessions. Mentors assisted students in creating a questionnaire. Each subgroup conducted its workshop inside the college's premise at a different location, such as a classroom, the canteen, an open area, etc. Approximately fifty questions, both subjective and objective, were created by each subgroup.



d) Questionnaire Approval

On the 23rd of Bhadra, all the students gathered to get approval on their questionnaire. Students gathered in the conference room as they had for orientation the day before. Sessions for the approval of the questionnaires were conducted three times. Three groups received separate calls. Teaching assistants Binda Kumari Thapa and Sunila Deuja were entrusted with assessing the submitted questions and requesting adjustments if they believed any were unsuitable as panelists for the questionnaire approval session. One or two students from each grouping were asked to present their questions to the full room. They were required to provide the panel one copy prior to their presentation. After asking their questions, the panelists provided feedback on the presentation. What changes must be made at whatever costs, and how the questions must be labeled. The panelists provided the necessary direction to each subgroup on how to confirm the questions.

After everyone had completed presentation, they were all sent back with their groups and mentors for one last round of question confirmation. After the group members gave their approval, the mentor presented the questions to the panelists for final approval. After the panelist's final confirmation, the questionnaire approval session concluded. The questions that had been finally confirmed were expected to be applied to the field area where the entrepreneurs were to be met.

e) Research

Students were assigned 3 days i.e. 26th, 27th and 28th Bhadra, respectively, for their research. The area of the research was limited to Kathmandu, Bhaktapur and Lalitpur. In addition to that, each group had to interview at least 30 respondents/ enterprises. While interviewing, they had to be dutiful to assure utmost confidentiality of the respondent. All of the group members went on field study on Bhadra 26th, 27th, and 28th with their different sub groups.



f) Presentation

The presentation took place on the 30th and 31st of Bhadra after the data and information collection was finished. Group A (Sub-group A, Sub-group B, Sub-group C, Sub-group D, and Sub-group E) and Group B (Sub-group A, Sub-group B, and Sub-group C) presented their research findings on 30th Bhadra. Additionally, Group C (Sub-group A, Sub-group B, Sub-group C, Sub-group D, Sub-

group E) and Group B (Sub-group D, Sub-group E) presented on Bhadra 31st. 15 minutes were allotted for the presentations for each group.



Prabhakar Chalise and Prakash B.K., a team, hosted the presentation. The sessions were visited over by Prof. Dr. Atindra Dahal and Prof. Hongkong Rana. As panelists, Associate Prof. Pradip Pathak, Assistant Prof. Anjana Ghimire, and Assistant Prof. Amrita Gautam remarked and passed feedbacks to students. They assessed the group's presentation and made appropriate observations. Students were questioned during a question-and-answer session about their research methodology and general experience. The audiences' queries were also answered in the interim.



Following the talk, Associate Prof. Pradip Pathak expanded on the fundamentals of entrepreneurship and further outlined the research criteria. Prof. Dr. Atindra Dahal's address brought the session to a close.



g) Report Submission and Reviews

Further the report prepared by the students was submitted to the department and the department members reviewed the presented report. After the review was done, the necessary changes to be made were informed to the students and amendment accordingly was asked. A session for the framing and formatting of the report in better way was held on 7th Ashoj, 2079, Friday. A new report as per the prescribed formatting is to be presented to the department with the necessary reworks required. Department shall process to archive and publish the reports if the gravity and weight is noticed up to the mark.

h) Orientation Session for Report Formatting

An online session regarding the formatting of the reports on the research done and presented by the first-year students was held on 23rd Sept. 2022, Friday. Asst. Prof Amrita Gautam, Teaching Asst. Binda Kumari Thapa and Teaching Asst. Sunila Deuja facilitated the students with the formatting. The formatting session basically was divided into three portions by the teachers respectively.

Asst. Prof Amrita Gautam provided overall highlights of the session. Basically, she gave an outline of the errors uncared by the students while preparing the report and dealing with the ideas of preparing it. She focused on the lapses made by the students while presenting it and what further details need to be added to the overall work to make the work uniformed. Teaching Asst. Binda Kumari Thapa dealt with the Introduction, methodology and the limitations part along with the technique of formatting mentioned as per KSL Citation Guideline. She also mentioned about the IRAC rule while preparing the report. She highlighted on the matters where the students have to

make corrections along with the basic technique of formatting (garamond, text- 12 size, heading 14 and main title 16, justified, 1.5 line spacing etc.). She also highlighted on the errors done by the students while preparing the graph, pie chart and the description provided. Teaching Asst. Sunila Deuja dealt with the analysis and conclusion part. She gave examples from her own thesis about title framing and how the outcome should be on the basis of the topic provided. She also dealt on the basics, like, who to be included while acknowledging, what things are to be included in the presentation part, analysis and conclusion part. Citing examples of her own thesis, she further directed the students about the annex part and the things students forgot to address in the report. She also told the students about dealing with the answers and preparing the report placing self in an unbiased position as a researcher.

The session ended with the questions flooded by the students and dealing with the questions. The students further were notified to submit a final report with the necessary changes to be made and add-ons to be done. The session of two hours was a fruitful one as most of the students participated in the discussion.
