Entrance Examination 2083 BS (2026 AD) – Information for Applicants

Introduction

The entrance examination is designed to serve as a comprehensive evaluation of applicants, beginning with the verification of their academic records and extending to a detailed appraisal of their intellectual abilities. It measures not only academic aptitude but also analytical reasoning, problem-solving skills and communication proficiency. In addition, the examination seeks to determine the overall preparedness of applicants to engage in and successfully complete the rigorous program of legal studies offered at the Kathmandu School of Law.

This document sets out the complete examination schedule, detailed instructions and essential guidelines for all applicants appearing in the B.A. LL.B. Entrance Examination for the Academic Year 2083 BS (2026 AD), which will be conducted over two days on **27 and 28 Aashar, 2083** (11 and 12 July, 2026).

Passing Criteria:

- Applicants must secure a **minimum of 45% (45 out of 100)** to be eligible for admission consideration.
- Final selection will be based on merit, with applicants ranked according to their overall performance.
- Applicants must attend all examination components (Interview, Written Test and Session -Based Exam).

Detailed Exam Schedule

1. Document Verification and Evaluation: In accordance with institutional criteria (10 Marks)

Activity: Verification of required documents and Evaluation of Credentials + other certificates submitted by the applicants.

Timing: The process will start before Day 1 examinations and continue until the final interview.

Documents to be verified or evaluated:

1. Citizenship/ID, Photographs
2. Academic transcripts of SEE Grade 10 - **3 Marks**
3. Academic transcripts of NEB - Grade 12 /A-Levels - **5 Marks**
4. Extracurricular activities (*To be presented separately during interview sessions*) – **2 Marks**

1. Written Test (30 marks)

Activity: Written examinations (subjective and objective) test.

Timing: 8:30 AM onwards.

Components & Marks Distribution:

1.1 Subjective Test: (1 Hour)

- Nepali Language Test (Subjective) – 10 marks:** Short essays, comprehension, translations, or language-based questions.
- English Language Test (Subjective) – 10 marks:** Essay writing, comprehension, translations, or grammar-based questions.

1.2 Objective Test: (20 Minutes)

- General Knowledge– 10 marks:** Multiple-choice questions (national and international issues, legal awareness, current affairs). *(20 short questions – multiple choice / fill the gaps / one sentence answer)*

2. Session-Based Examination (30 Marks)

Activity: All applications will be categorized into two distinct groups, each assigned to a separate hall for their respective sessions. Upon the completion of all two sessions, a written examination will follow.

Timing: 10:00 AM onwards. The detailed schedule will be provided on the examination day.

Structure: (30 Minutes presentation + 20 Minutes discussion + 20 Minutes Writing)

2.1 Session 1: Contemporary Issue: Presentation on contemporary issue (In Nepali)

Lunch Break

2.2 Session 2: Legal Issue: Presentation on any legal issue (In English)

Evaluation Criteria:

- Ability to analyze and present ideas logically.
- Clarity of thought and confidence in presenting arguments.
- Critical thinking and analytical depth in problem-solving.
- Depth and originality in the written answers.

Day 2 (28th Ashar, 2083, Sunday) 12 July, 2026 AD

3. Interview (30 marks)

Activity: Individual oral assessment before the examination panel.

Timing: Will commence at 8:30 AM onwards. The detailed group allocations and timings will be published later on the official college website and social media platforms. Applicants must attend only their scheduled session, as groups will be processed sequentially throughout the day.

Duration: Approximately **8 - 10 minutes per applicant.**

Focus Areas:

- **Analytical Ability:** Logical thinking and problem-solving skills.
- **Communication Skills:** Clarity, articulation and confidence in expression.
- **Motivation:** Understanding of law as a field of study and career choice.
- **General Awareness:** Knowledge of current social and legal issues.
- **Attitude:** Respectfulness, receptiveness, and professional conduct.

Note: Applicants must bring documents for thorough assessment of credentials, extracurricular activities and verification of application form accuracy. These will be discussed and reviewed during the interview session.

Instructions to Applicants

1. Regarding Entrance Card

1.1 Entrance Card Distribution

- The entrance card will be issued to applicants via their registered email address (the same address used for submission of the application form and verification).
- The card will be dispatched two days prior to the commencement of the entrance examination. **If the entrance card is not received, applicants are required to promptly email their details to admission@ksl.edu.np for verification and re-issuance.**

1.2 Printing and Preparation

- Applicants are required to print the entrance card in duplicate.
- Both copies must be duly completed with accurate information.
- A recent passport-size photograph must be affixed on each copy.

1.3 Submission and Use

- The two completed copies of the entrance card must be presented on the day of the entrance examination.
- Both copies will be required for admission and participation on each examination day.

2. Reporting Time & Documents:

2.1 The entrance examination will be conducted across multiple classrooms on each day of the test. Your specific group allocation, room assignment and reporting time will be published later on the college notice boards, college website and social media portals of college.

2.2 Report at least **30 minutes before** the scheduled exam time.

2.3 Carry the following documents:

- a. Entrance Card
- b. Valid Citizenship/ID card or equivalent (Original academic transcripts and academic certificates are not required)
- c. Certificates of Participation and Achievement in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities - e.g., speech, debate, moot, MUN, sports, talent show (singing / dance / art / drama / content creation), blood-donation etc. **(to be presented on the second day, i.e., interview day only).**
- d. Required stationery (black pen, pencil, eraser, etc.)

3. Rules during Examination

- Mobile phones, smart watches and electronic devices are strictly prohibited.
- Any form of plagiarism, cheating, or misconduct will lead to immediate disqualification.
- Applicants must dress neatly and maintain discipline throughout the exam.

Note: Applicants must ensure all submitted documents are complete and consistent with the application form details. Failure to provide any required document or discrepancies in submitted materials will lead to automatic disqualification from the admission process.
